

THREE MORE PRELIMINARY BOUTS ADDED TO EFC 136



JOHANNESBURG, South Africa – 4 July 2026

Following an action-packed EFC 135, attention now turns to EFC 136, with three more preliminary bouts confirmed for the August 6 event at the World Sports Betting EFC Arena in Johannesburg.

The latest additions feature experienced EFC veterans, decorated amateur talent making the transition to the professional ranks, and athletes eager to build momentum as they continue their careers inside the Hexagon.

MAJUBA VS VAN ASWEGEN

Pretoria veteran Given "Bonecracker" Majuba returns to face Johannesburg's Seth van Aswegen in a compelling striker versus striker contest.

Representing Mamelodi Warriors under coach Moses Manaka, Majuba is one of the promotion's longest-serving competitors. A tall, calculated kickboxer, he has built his reputation on precise striking, punishing leg kicks and relentless pressure. While many opponents have struggled to match him on the feet, this contest presents another intriguing stylistic challenge against an accomplished boxer making the transition to mixed martial arts.

Standing opposite him is Van Aswegen, who makes his long-awaited EFC debut after competing in the professional boxing ranks. Representing Apex MMA South under coach Wilhelm Strauss, the athletic 23-year-old enters the organisation looking to showcase the evolution of his all-round MMA game while making full use of his crisp boxing combinations and movement.

The matchup promises an entertaining striking battle as two stand-up specialists meet inside the Hexagon.

MULUMBA VS SHINDANO

Another intriguing welterweight contest sees Democratic Republic of Congo athlete Kabongo Peter Mulumba take on Cape Town prospect Mutabi Shindano.

Representing Durban's Mustang Athletic under coach Wayne Raman, Mulumba returns for his third EFC appearance after hard-fought contests against Armando De Crescenzo and Alex Suzuki. A physically strong judoka with heavy hands, he enters the bout looking to secure his first professional victory and build momentum.

Standing opposite him is one of the card's most accomplished amateur athletes. Training out of the Cape Town gym of former EFC lightweight champion Don Madge, Shindano makes his professional debut after compiling an impressive 8-2 amateur record and capturing the IMMAF African middleweight championship. With a boxing background and proven amateur pedigree, he arrives as an exciting new addition to the welterweight division.

Experience inside the EFC Hexagon meets decorated amateur success in what promises to be an intriguing test for both athletes.

VILAKAZI VS EMBOMBE

The preliminary card also features a flyweight contest between Pretoria's Siyanda "Bhubesi" Vilakazi and Democratic Republic of Congo athlete Story Mpia Embombe.

Representing Mamelodi Warriors under coach Moses Manaka, Vilakazi returns after securing an important submission victory at EFC 133. Known for his aggressive kickboxing style, he has continued to develop his ground game and now looks to build on the momentum generated by that victory.

Embombe, who trains out of Johannesburg's RAW Combination FTC under coach Rodrique Kena, enters the contest searching for his first professional victory. A long-range striker with an aggressive approach, the 23-year-old will be looking to turn his fortunes around against another experienced opponent.

The bout also marks a second appearance in this release for Mamelodi Warriors, highlighting the continued contribution of the Pretoria gym to the EFC roster.

The EFC 136 event is headlined by Sanchez vs Swanepoel for the interim lightweight championship and is presented by World Sports Betting live from the World Sports Betting EFC Arena in Johannesburg, South Africa on August 6.
